The program offers **Three** graduation path:

- (i) **Coursework and Research Report Path** (39 credits for coursework + 6 credits for research report).

- (iii) **Coursework and Research Thesis Path** (12 credits for coursework + 33 credits for research thesis presentation, defend and publication at a recognized journal)
